

A message from Ian Waring-Green our new Focal Minister

I suspect (maybe wrongly, and if so I'm sure someone will tell me!) that the words "trail-blazing" and "Bighton" have not often been used in the same sentence. However, Bishop David rectified that on Sunday 5th December in All Saints' Church. In very good form, in spite of a voice on the verge of giving out, he presided at the first such service in the Diocese of Winchester: a service of commissioning me as Focal Minister to Bighton. (You will see from the photo that I have a Certificate to prove it!) This was followed later in the afternoon by a similar service to commission Sue Armstrong in St Mary's Old Alresford. The two of us are the first FM's in Winchester and join a small (but, I suspect, increasing) number in the UK.

The role is in response to the ever-more stretched clergy, most of whom are looking after several churches at once. The FM role is, among other things, to:

- Be the local point of contact in the parish for their whole community
- Be the 2-way link between the parish and the incumbent
- Lead worship and undertake work (pastoral etc) as agreed with the incumbent
- Actively encourage the development of the talents and gifts of all in the worshipping community
- To be, with the incumbent, mindful of the need to be aware of anyone as a
 possible future candidate for the role to ensure a continuing ministry of
 this kind in the parish.

I look forward to meeting more of you, and expanding the ways in which I can serve this terrific community.
